Indoor Housing

Birds must be kept in secure enclosures with a double-door entry system to prevent escape.

Enclosures must meet wire and mesh minimum standards applicable to the species.

Enclosures should be mounted on a secure stand with lockable doors to prevent escape.

Outdoor Housing

Birds must be kept in secure enclosures with a double-door entry system to prevent escape.

Enclosures must meet wire and mesh minimum standards applicable to the species.

Aviaries and enclosures should be securely fastened to a concrete base or pegged to the ground, with netting and post uprights buried at least 300 mm into the ground.

Structural Requirements:

Aviaries and enclosures must use appropriate load-bearing materials within the framework:

• Timber: 50 mm x 50 mm

Angle iron: 25 mm x 25 mm x 3.17 mm

Steel rod: 12 mm internal diameter

Additional Measures

- Wire netting laid under breakable sheet coverings such as PVC or fiberglass.
- Fine mesh to prevent contact or predation by wild birds and vermin.
- Birds must not be allowed to walk or fly outdoors.
