### Sponsored Restoration Project Biodiversity Conference 2025

#### Key features

- Co-designed with local Traditional Owners, the project will establish best practice, demonstrating large-scale, diverse land restoration that meets 5-star ecological restoration standards
- Establish best practice on a 358ha demonstration site by revegetating 250ha of low-value, degraded farmland in a hydrological 'at risk' area

#### Aims

- Achieve diverse ecological restoration at scale, reducing habitat fragmentation in a global biodiversity hotspot
- Reduce salinity and waterlogging by lowering the water table
- Conserve and improve complex ecological communities across the project site, including woodlands, Kwongan shrublands and saline systems
- Rebuild a conservation estate on marginal farmland
- Support and further Aboriginal economic development opportunities, ensuring ongoing involvement with Traditional Owners and the wider community

#### Activities

- Integration of Traditional Owner Knowledge and economic participation; working in collaboration with the Binalup Rangers to implement project activities including seed collection and ecological research
- Revegetation using a combination of direct seeding and hand planting to achieve diverse landscape restoration at-scale
- Knowledge-sharing activities to provide an opportunity for farmers and individuals to understand local restoration options for low and non-yielding soils
